# ONLY WHEN WE CAN RECOGNISE THE GOOD FROM THE BAD, THE RARE FROM THE COMMONPLACE, $\mathcal{E}$ THE IMPORTANT FROM THE TRIVIAL ...

At City & Country we often find ourselves working with listed buildings that have been passed down from one generation to the next, sometimes over many hundreds of years. Often their owners have taken a harsh functional approach to their evolution and maintenance rather than the more sympathetic approach that these wonderful heritage assets deserve.


We feel privileged to rescue these historic treasures and therefore treat them with real respect, taking a great deal of time to understand them as best we can before we start any work. We employ architectural historians to delve through the physical fabric on site and the archives of historical information available, such as period photos and original drawings.

This allows us to produce an Historic Building Assessment that can inform its redevelopment and conservation. Only when we can recognise the good from the bad, the rare from the commonplace, and the important from the trivial, do we start work. Like a joiner who needs to understand the grain and the nature of a piece of wood before he starts, we need to understand the many layers of history before we begin.

At King Edward VII Hospital in Midhurst, West Sussex, we discovered the exact planting records that had been produced by the great landscape designer Gertrude Jekyll as she checked the gardeners had followed her planting scheme. This has provided us with the means to recreate exactly what she had planned over a century ago.

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### ... DO WE START WORK

Sometimes the history is only revealed once modern layers have been removed. We do this early in the process so that, with this knowledge, we can create a scheme that is responsive to the history, highlighting key features and making them the stars of our proposals.

At The Galleries in Brentwood the building's ingenious metal 'asylum' windows, patented by George Myers (the renowned builder who worked extensively with Pugin), but largely stripped out by the NHS, were not recognised until our team in their research uncovered the exact description that allowed a window in a semi~basement room and another within the old workshops to be identified as original Myers' windows. As a result of this fortuitous discovery they were conserved and remain in situ.

Sometimes the history is only revealed once modern layers have been removed. We do this early in the process so that, with this knowledge, we can create a scheme that is responsive to the history, highlighting key features and making them the stars of our proposals. Grand staircases, plasterwork ceilings, fine proportioned windows, hand carved fireplaces and doors, vistas through ornate gardens, and the orientation of the sun, all drive the final design to provide places that enhance the properties while being sensitive to their historic context.

Our research also drives the design of the new additions so the detailing is historically correct and new buildings pay the appropriate respect to the main attraction.

### BREATHING NEW LIFE & PURPOSE INTO HISTORIC BUILDINGS

City & Country's completed projects are our own very best advertisement. The inherent excellence in design and construction quality continues to excite and delight visitors, stakeholders and residents alike. Working closely with English Heritage, local authority planners and designers, and our own team of experts, City & Country applies fresh and original thinking to space planning whilst preserving the original proportions, features and splendour of the prestigious and eminent buildings with which we work.

We also place a strong emphasis on building long term relationships to ensure that we have a regular team of excellent contractors and suppliers of appropriate materials. Our construction methods, design and materials, combine a careful balance of traditional and contemporary influences.

It is this sympathetic and understanding approach which gifts renewed life to some of the country's most important heritage assets and ensures their survival for the enjoyment of future generations, by bringing them back into long term and beneficial use.



# RECOGNISING THE IMPORTANCE & VALUE OF LANDSCAPE & ECOLOGY

The natural environment has an enormously positive effect on people's lives so we always work to integrate beautiful landscapes, rich in biodiversity, within all our developments. To ensure that our team has an in~depth knowledge of the habitats at each site we undertake detailed ecological surveys for protected wildlife, trees, and of course the historic landscape.

We invest heavily in good plants and high quality landscaping from the earliest stages of development and pride ourselves on our commitment to distinctive designs that complement and enhance the historic setting of our properties. The Group reinstates both original soft and hard landscaping features such as garden follies, sweeping formal drives, huge avenues and blends these with the new designs to create a soft, attractive and appropriate backdrop.

At The Galleries in Brentwood, the meticulous restoration and conversion of a Victorian hospital in the Tudor style,

City & Country discovered the original plans including detailed drawings showing formal gardens and 'airing courtyards' designed for patients of the hospital. These detailed proposals were never realised but they have now been included for the benefit of future residents as part of the extensive award winning landscape masterplan. These beautiful landscaped and tranquil courtyard gardens now provide a space for the quiet enjoyment of the historic setting and form the focal point for the development.


# RECOGNISING THE IMPORTANCE & VALUE OF LANDSCAPE & ECOLOGY

St Osyth Priory not only contains a Registered Park and Garden, which are Grade II listed, it also encompasses a Scheduled Ancient Monument and 22 listed structures, which include a number of Grade I listed buildings. The restoration of both the buildings and the parkland is fundamental in saving this significant and complex estate from dereliction.

The estate is rich in flora and fauna with more than 200 species of birds, invertebrates, bats, amphibians, mammals and reptiles found across a variety of habitats, some of which are designated Sites of Special Scientific Interest, Special Areas of Conservation, Ramsar and Special Protection Areas. City & Country is working closely with local, regional and national advisory bodies including Natural England, The Environment Agency, RSPB and Essex Wildlife Trust, to ensure that the best approach is being taken to conserve and repair this important environment.

Through the repair of the scarred landscape, much of which has been used for mineral extraction, the reinstatement of hedgerows, the planting of more than 1,100 new trees, the restoration of the historic deer banks, the replanting of the historic gardens and avenues and the refurbishment of several lakes that are scattered across the landscape, it is proposed that the Parkland will be saved for future generations.



## UNLOCKING THE VALUE IN CHALLENGING & COMPLEX SITES

City & Country continues to thrive on opportunities that are complex and challenging where others do not appreciate the value or find it difficult to evaluate the risk. By buying or partnering on these hidden quality sites and through care, attention to detail and excellent design, we create new developments of real and lasting value.

Using our ever increasing knowledge we are confident that we will be able to continue to respond to the numerous opportunities that become available; whether as a result of a reduction in local authority budgets or Government departments looking to dispose of assets, we know that the public sector can reduce their liabilities and at the same time, transform and utilise their often run down and poorly maintained listed buildings.

The company portfolio includes a number of challenging projects, such as previously 'failed' schemes and bank repossessions, which have created partnering opportunities. This kind of opportunity requires a unique skill~set and a strong track record to realise the true potential of the site and City & Country works hard to bring together the ideal team to produce imaginative yet realistic and viable solutions.

King Edward VII Hospital in Midhurst which incorporates a range of Grade II and Grade II\* listed buildings and gardens is a good example of one such project. Macquarie Bank chose us as their development partner for our strong track record in delivering highly challenging restoration projects. The remit was to find a solution to rescue the former hospital from its perilous state while trying to recoup the bank's investment.

Planning consent to transform this important building into a thriving community in the heart of the South Downs National Park was received in November 2011, following a completely new approach to the proposals being adopted. We were very careful to take full account of the sensitive nature of the setting and the significance of the heritage assets, while undertaking a detailed consultation and engagement programme.

# UNLOCKING THE VALUE IN CHALLENGING & COMPLEX SITES

At Balls Park in Hertford this former university campus, which comprised the Grade I, II\* and II listed Mansion, Coach House and Stables, four cottages and a range of ugly 1960s and 1970s educational buildings, had a particularly difficult development brief. Their vision had been for a mixed use development with limited residential, none of which was allowed in the Grade I listed mansion.

After lengthy discussions with the local authority, English Heritage and key stakeholders, a solution was found which created 132 sensitively designed new build homes to fund the restoration of the listed buildings. Forty apartments have been created in the listed buildings through a set of

very careful restoration and conversion proposals. The design creatively retains the original grandiose proportions of the principal rooms and provides magnificent apartments that will be cherished by their owners and in so doing provide the long term, secure future they deserve.

#### ENGAGING WITH THE COMMUNITY INVESTING IN SOCIETY

City & Country recognises the importance of engaging in extensive and meaningful dialogue with key stakeholders and the local community, over and above what is required by planning policy. The heritage assets that we are seeking to protect invariably have strong, long standing and emotional associations with the local community as well as their inherent value in terms of heritage significance and context.

By communicating at an early stage we can encourage and empower local people to contribute towards shaping our proposals, so that they take account of community needs, aspirations and priorities. A greater understanding of the benefits that flow from heritage restoration and how this regeneration acts as a catalyst for further economic and social improvements enable the communities to make better and well~informed judgements and to become part of the solution, where difficult compromises often need to be made.

For example the Government's 2010 Heritage Counts Report Impact of Historic Environment Regeneration 1 October 2010, reported that in its survey about the perceived benefits of heritage~led restoration, over 90% of respondents believed that heritage~led regeneration leads to a positive contribution to the local environment, results in a nicer place in which to live, work and socialise, raises pride in the local area and creates a sense of place.

We have recently joined forces with George Clarke  $\sim$  Channel 4's 'Restoration Man'  $\sim$  to help us raise awareness of the plight of the significant number of historic and listed building in the UK. We share a passion for architecture, design and historic buildings which made the collaboration between us the perfect fit.

In October 2011, we officially launched a joint campaign ~ Save Our Architectural Legacy (SOAL) - designed to raise awareness of the country's collection of historic assets and urge people to recognise the importance of protecting them. At a time when the public sector faces difficult choices about how to fulfil their responsibilities with reduced resources, the SOAL campaign is designed to highlight that, in the wrong hands, these civic properties could be demolished, damaged irrevocably or left to go to ruin.

By the very nature of the restoration projects we embrace, each presents its own challenges, and this has been recognised by a wide spectrum of independent experts.

'City & Country may be approaching its 50th Birthday but it is used to working with buildings much older than that. Its portfolio of restorative work in sensitive conservation areas, or around listed buildings, is deeply impressive and its thirst for knowledge of the architectural history around which it might be working is insatiable, meaning it offers creative, new designs in keeping with their surroundings, whatever the weight of heritage around them.

You only have to see stunning projects such as The Galleries in Brentwood, Balls Park in Hertford and Old Saint Michaels in Braintree to realise the scope and scale of its restorations. Architectural conviction and enthusiasm clearly resonates throughout the business.'
